- Ambassadors in Hope & Opportunity: Report postponed until next meeting
- **Hannah Freedom School**: No report today although Episcopal Charities is in discussion re: future funding. School plans to open summer program in June.
- Partners in Health (Haiti): New hospital in Mirebelais (60 km NE of Port-au-Prince) completed & will open this year (see image below).
 Additional accomplishments:
 - Doubling the size of its mental health and psychosocial support team. This
 work is supported by a recent \$1.5 million Grand Challenges Canada grant
 to improve mental health care in countries affected by disaster and poverty.
 In 2013, PIH will train community health workers to identify and support
 people suffering from mental health problems, including depression and
 post-traumatic stress, and refer them to appropriate medical facilities.
 - Cholera has killed 7,750 people in Haiti since October 2010. In spring 2012, PIH successfully pioneered Haiti's first oral cholera vaccine, delivering vaccines to nearly 100,000 people in partnership with Haiti's Ministry of Health and the nonprofit organization GHESKIO.
 - In partnership with Abbott Laboratories and the Abbott Fund, PIH will open a new production facility in early 2013 to combat the long-standing challenges of malnutrition. Located in Corporant, the facility will be used to

- produce a minimum of 60 tons of Nourimanba (a ready-to-use therapeutic food) to treat up to 6,000 cases of pediatric malnutrition in its first year.

2. Other Projects:

- **Episcopal Charities:** Report postponed until next meeting.
- ❖ Mt. Carmel Lunches: Monthly luncheons are going well with about 32 meals served and as many as 20-25 take home meals provided. Abundance of volunteers in December with plenty of food. Will look to see if another parishioner can take leadership of meals 3-4 times/year to give Jane a break.
- St. Anne's Circle: Sessions will focus on projects that encourage handmade arts such as baby blankets and doll clothes (to encourage younger families participating). Christmas Bazaar to be held in December. St. Anne's is experiencing a lack of volunteers, as are many of our ministries.
- Holidays: Giving Tree: Gifts for 76 residents were delivered with parishioners supplying all but 22. Will limit to 70 next year and schedule a post coffee hour gift wrapping session.
 Thank you to Jane & Tom Brophy for their wonderful leadership in this project.

New Business:

- **1. Donations:** 1st contribution of the year, \$500, will be given to Discretionary Fund.
- 2. **Direction for 2012**: Deacon Annette led us in an initial discussion about where we want to go for the next year, to be continued over the next few meetings. Congregation will be brought into the discussion at the Annual Meeting in February.
